A FAITHFUL HENCHMAN

Titus 1:1 - 16

Text: “Paul. . . To Titus, mine own son after the common faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour” (Titus 1:1, 4).

Many times the name “henchman” has been used in a critical and/or derogatory way. However, this is not necessarily the meaning of the word. Webster defines it as “an attendant, squire, or page.” A henchman is a trusted follower and supporter. Titus comes under the concept of being a follower and supporter of Paul. Thus the title “A Faithful Henchman” is given to him.

Not a great deal is known about Titus, but he was a star in Paul’s opinion. He was one of the most trusted and valuable helpers Paul had, and Paul called him “my true son” (1:4 NIV).

I. Look at the kind of man Titus was.

A. *He was a companion in an awkward and difficult time.* When Paul was having a difficult time, Titus was by his side and was a faithful friend. When Paul paid his visit to Jerusalem to a church that suspected him and was prepared to mistrust and dislike him, he took Titus with him (Gal. 2:1). “Then fourteen years after I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, and took Titus with me also”.

B. *He was a man for a tough assignment.* When the trouble at Corinth was at its worst, Paul sent Titus there with one of the harshest letters he ever wrote (2 Cor. 8:16). “But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you”.

It took a person with real character to fulfill such an assignment, but Titus had the strength of mind and the toughness of fiber that enabled him to face and handle a difficult situation.

There are two kinds of people in the world. One is the



kind that can make a bad situation worse. The other is the kind that can bring order out of chaos and peace out of strife. Titus was of the latter.

C. *Titus was a man with a gift for practical administration.* Because of Titus’ talent, Paul chose Titus to be the one to organize the collection for the poor members of the church at Corinth (2 Cor. 8:6, 10). “Insomuch that we desired Titus, that as he had begun, so he would also finish in you the same grace also. And herein I give my advice: for this is expedient for you, who have begun before, not only to do, but also to be forward a year ago”.

We ought to thank God for people to whom we can turn when a job needs to be done.

II. Paul gave Titus some affectionate names.

A. *Paul called him his true son.* This title probably means that Paul was instrumental in the conversion of Titus. An experience of this nature brings joy to any Christian.

B. *Paul called him his brother (2 Cor. 8:23).* “Whether any do enquire of Titus, he is my partner and fellow helper concerning you: or our brethren be enquired of, they are the messengers of the churches, and the glory of Christ”.

When a child in the faith becomes a brother in the faith, it

is a great day.

C. Paul said that Titus walked in the Spirit (2 Cor. 12:18). "I desired Titus, and with him I sent a brother. Did Titus make a gain of you? Walked we not in the same spirit? Walked we not in the same steps"?

Paul knew Titus would deal with things as he himself would. Paul had a lieutenant to whom he could commit his work and know it would be done right. Therefore Paul sent Titus to Crete to be a pattern for the Christians there (Titus 2:7). "In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity"....

Titus was not just to talk to them about what a Christian should be, but was to show them what one should be. No greater compliment can be paid to a person than this. Titus is a good example for all. Everyone needs to develop the character of trustworthiness and dependability.

In 2019, may I call on each one to be henchman/henchwomen for Christ? May we believe and live in such a way that many will receive Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord.

Motion

Motion to amend

Whereas the present Constitution Article 7 A) specifies "The number of Executive Offices shall be fifteen (15)"; and

Whereas the present Bylaw Article 4 C) identifies 16 Executive Offices (General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, General Treasurer, and the various Regional Secretaries - 13 in number); and

Whereas these two Articles are in conflict; and

Whereas our past practice has been to elect an Assistant General Secretary who is also a Regional Secretary, thereby adhering to Constitution Article 7 A) but not Bylaw Article 4 C);

Therefore, be it resolved to amend Constitution Article 7 A) as follows:

The powers of this organization shall be exercised and its affairs conducted by the Executive Officers. The number of the Executive Offices shall be the number of Regional Secretaries plus a minimum of two (2). The number of the Executive Officers provided for may be changed by a Motion at the National Convention increasing or decreasing the number of Regional Secretaries, providing the number not be allowed to decrease to a total less than five (5). Such a Motion must receive a minimum 2/3 majority support.

And further, be it resolved to amend Bylaw Article 4 C) by adding:

One of either the Assistant General Secretary or General Treasurer positions may also be occupied by an existing Regional Secretary.

This motion gives the option to:

Increase the number of Regional Secretaries by a motion at the National Convention rather than requiring a Constitution or Bylaw change which requires longer advance notice.

Allows for the Assistant General Secretary to be elected from either the existing Regional Secretaries or from the general membership, thereby allowing for more assistance to the General Secretary without violating either the Constitution or the Bylaws.

Allows for the General Treasurer to be elected from either the existing Regional Secretaries or from the general membership without violating either the Constitution or the Bylaws.

Avoids confusion in interpreting Bylaw Article 4 C).

IAOGI Youth Ministries Committee

The Inuit Youth Discipleship Training Program that was launched out in the Arctic in 2017 has successfully completed phase two in 2018 and is in the plans to continue 2019 moving into another territory in Nunavut (yellow star map below). This is an intense training/mentoring program designed to equip, mentor, and raise up emerging young leaders and anyone with a heart to be discipled in the area of their calling or in youth ministries. As part of ministry, we are pleased to announce that church visits will begin this year, 2019. This will be accompanied with high school visits in six Nunavik communities (red dotted map below) by two of IAOGI youth ministries committee members.

The purpose of the church visits is to meet with young pastors and or emerging leaders to come alongside the local church young leaders to bring support so that the vision and call that God has for them comes into momentum. We will offer various types of support either by hosting conferences with them, help gear them towards youth projects or help them in developing prayer groups, youth nights, Bible studies, music, etc. for this year so that they have a sense of Kingdom building regionally, nationally, or globally - basically doing ministry together. We are going as commissioned by Jesus in Matthew 28:19.

IAOGI presentations and updates are continually a part of these trainings so that there is a sense of family all across Canada.

The community visits will be accompanied by school visits which aim to bring teaching on value, uniqueness, goal setting, dealing with peer pressure, etc. - basically to help equip pre-teens to deal with social challenges they face.

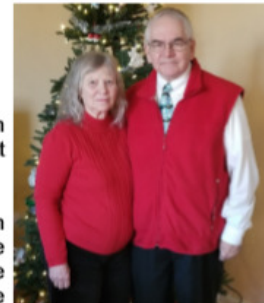

We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.
Romans 8:28 NRSV

I cry to God Most High, to God who fulfills his purpose for me. Psalm 57:2 NRSV

Once you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord; walk as children of light. Ephesians 5:8 (RSV)

Recently I read a story about a woman named Mary Jones who was born in 1784 in Wales. Mary was brought up by her parents who were weavers and learned about the Lord by attending church. The family could not afford a Bible nor could Mary read. A school eventually opened next to her village and Mary learned to read enough where she was asked to read scripture at her neighbour's farm every Saturday.

Mary's wish was to have her own Bible. In those days scripture was rare and expensive so Mary worked and save for 6 years until she had enough to purchase a Bible. She then heard that a certain minister was selling Bibles 25 miles away from her village. She set out bare-footed to walk the hilly terrain to purchase one. When she arrived and Rev. Thomas Charles told her that all the Bibles were spoken for, Mary buried her head in her hands and wept. Overcome by compassion Rev. Charles was compelled to give one to Mary. The incident had an impact on the minister and he vowed not to rest until he found a way to provide a means of supplying Bibles for those in Wales who wanted one. In 1800 Rev. Charles went to London, England, with the sole purpose of publishing and distributing the world of God, not only to Wales, but to the whole world. The British and Foreign Bible Society was established as a result. Our own Canadian Bible Society owes its origins to the persistent actions of a village girl named Mary.

As I sat with the story I asked, "Lord, when was the last time I saw anyone walk over 50 miles and work for 6 years just to get a Bible?" As I prayed for those who did not have a Bible the Lord brought back to my mind an event that happened when I was working with *Youth With a Mission* in Jamaica.

In Montego Bay we missionaries were told that the church there was quite conservative when it came to the means of dress and makeup. For me giving up wearing make-up, jeans, and earrings was quite a feat so I negotiated with the leaders. "If I give up wearing make-up and earrings and jeans for the time we were there, could I on our last day get my hair braided and allow me to paint my nails and put my make-up and jeans back on?" (I was and am always modest anyways). "Agreed," said the leaders. "On your last day here you get to wear what you like!"

On the last night of our mission a young teen took over 3 hours to braid my hair and we sat together as I painted my nails.

I also had to make a decision whether to stay or go as I had been asked by a pastor to stay in the country and co-pastor a church where a congregation fell in love with my bold style (sans the makeup and jeans). I turned down the offer to stay and co-pastor because I missed Canada, although I wondered at times if that was the right thing to do. I loved the Jamaicans, swimming, and walking through Montego Bay.

The next morning I put on my make-up, jeans and earrings and off we went to walk to catch our ride to the airport back to Canada. As our group walked past the public beach to get to the Montego Bay airport suddenly a tall young Jamaican man bolted out of nowhere, ran up to me, and said, "Wait, wait! May I ask you something?" As I looked towards my colleagues for support they bowed their heads, kept quiet, and kept walking.

"Sure," was my reply. "What would you like to ask me?" We kept walking.

He asked, "You are a Christian, aren't you?"

I almost laughed out loud. "Why, yes, I am a Christian!" I replied. "But what made you think I was a Christian? Why would you single me out in this group when I am the only one wearing braids and nail polish and jeans?"

He said, "No, no, it's not the braids or jeans or anything like that. It is the way you walk that tells me you are a Christian."

"The way I walk?" I asked stunned. "What do you mean, the way I walk?" Now I was curious!

The young man replied, "You walk with purity and with purpose! What is your purpose?"

For the next few minutes I had a chance to tell this young man what that purpose in my life was which was to follow Jesus Christ, to tell others about God's love, and to reconnect and guide them to their God given divine purpose through the love of the work of Jesus Christ.

When we were almost out of the area limits he pleaded, "Please, please, do you have a Bible I can have? I would really love to have a Bible."

"I don't have a Bible."

"Please, I must have a Bible!" he cried.

As I looked for an extra Bible in my suitcase someone handed me one to give to him. I stop and marked out the New Testament book of *John* for him to start reading. draws others, not by what we wear or don't wear!"

But perhaps it is also because of how we walk. Mary Jones walked for miles and miles with anticipation hoping to receive a Bible. She had no shoes and yet her feet were ready for the journey because she took each step with purpose. Her commitment and resolve in working for 6 years and walking for 50 miles just to buy a Bible only for her journey to be watered by disappointed tears moved someone to compassion resulting in more than just one Bible being put into her hand. Her seed of toil birthed Bibles being put into the hands of thousands of people just like Mary, those hungry for the Word of God. The scriptures tell us: ***As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace.*** Ephesians 6:15 NRSV

Mary Jones' story and that event in Jamaica taught me never to underestimate who may be "watching" us as we walk and what happens when we walk with purpose. Never take it for granted that the Bible we can so freely read in our country is always available to everyone everywhere. Further still, those seeking will see our hearts. It wasn't my braided hair, my nail polish, or my jeans that caught this young man's attention - it was my walk, my walk with purpose, God's purpose. He is not the first or last person to tell me this.

As I mature I wonder, "What does my walk look like now? Do I still walk with a purpose that others notice? Do I still stand out from the crowd, from the group, because God has set me apart, not aside?"

Jesus walked everywhere and crowds followed Him to hear good news. He stood out. He was set apart! What if He had stood still and hid Himself in a temple somewhere waiting for others to come into a building in order to hear the good news? Last I read the Great Commission told me to, "Go into all the world!" The world is a big place. Start walking!

Lastly, would you stand out enough in a crowd for someone to take notice that you are here on this earth *walking* with purpose?

Lord, help us to always be ready for those who are brave enough to move and reach out, to have an answer for those who ask, and to wear whatever it is we need to wear to bring the gospel of peace to others. Help us to *walk* with the seeker long enough to guide them on the way to an eternal home. And thank you, Lord, we never walk alone. You are with us, always.

This year we mark 25 years of ministry in India and 20 years involvement in Nepal. God as always has been incredibly faithful. I believe as we honor Him He fully releases His blessings!

Our ministry has been growing. We are very proud of our leaders as they are doing a fantastic work for God.

We have added 4 new little girls to our daycare and increased staff. We have 2 facilities where we look after 75 children. They receive protection, schooling, and healthy food, as well as loving ministry. As God blesses we will expand. These are part of the millions that come from India's slums. It is a wide-open door to bring the gospel to the many who we know so well. This year we have 10 in higher education: 4 in engineering, 1 in degree nursing, and the rest are in college. Our oldest has her degree in nursing and is pursuing career in the hospitals. We plan to have her work in Singapore and connect with a great church there. She is my daughter and we wish to have her part of the ministry.

Our leaders spent several months in Odisha training about 40 young people and ministering in many of the churches. This year they started 6 churches plus opened up 10 new preaching points in 10 new villages with our team of young evangelists and pastors. God moved in miracles - a very sick woman was instantly healed in one village!

We have broken poverty in our prototype village plus provided them with safe drinking water. We hope with the help of Rotary to bring similar projects to 12 more villages. Our vision is to bring Christ to all 2400 villages in this area. The district is very poor and breaking poverty opens

doors of favor and also assists the churches to be self-sufficient.

At present we are preparing with a team of 11 to head back to Singapore, India, and Nepal. We have started **Grace Life Nepal Trust** and we believe to rescue vulnerable children plus women caught in slavery. We would ask for prayers, as we will be in Nepal March 1-8 to start this part of our ministry. Nepal has been in great darkness for thousands of years yet now God is moving and the church is growing very fast. We need prayer, as this nation is very dark, so we can see a great move of God.

It is interesting that the great earthquake in 2015 that devastated much of Nepal destroyed many major temples in Katmandu. Our mission as His church is to depose the false demonic deities that have caused such misery for thousands of years in Nepal and to rather enthrone Jesus Christ as the rightful ruler over this nation. This will happen as we pray and bring the Gospel. Like the many we minister to in India the Nepalese people are wonderful. They are meant to be a treasure to the Creator Who made them. That Christ may be glorified!!

Tent of David Ministries

Every year the Tent of David holds a prophetic watch on New Year's Eve to discern what God is saying for the coming year. This is a compilation of the words given this year. It's going to be a good year!

A Year of Signs, Wonders and Miracles: the emphasis this year will be on Signs. There will signs in the heavens and on the earth which speak powerfully into what God is doing and where we are on God's time clock. It will be a Daniel year where God reveals hidden mysteries that were in plain view in scripture, but not seen until now. "He reveals the deep and secret things; He knows what is in the darkness, and the light dwells with Him." Daniel 2:22

God began to show us this late in 2018 on our prophetic journey in Israel. At one point when we were there, a cloud appeared in the sky clearly in the shape of the Hebrew letter Chet. The letter Chet is the number 8, and is a picture of a doorway, speaking of transition into the new. As that letter formed in the sky, a dark cloud began to appear and the horizon of the Mediterranean Sea where we were staying became very starkly visible. We kept saying "Look at the horizon!" When I got home, I felt compelled to look in several years of my journals and as I did I came across a word that the Lord gave me years ago: "When you see the cloud, you will know that the shift is upon you. It is on the horizon." The Lord, through this sign is clearly saying, the shift is here. The appointed time has come! We are coming into a new ERA or intersection of time.

The next sign came when we were walking along the pier at the waterfront and an Arab fisherman began to repeat the word "Enigma" while looking at us. The word enigma means "puzzle". Daniel 5:12 says, "Inasmuch as an excellent spirit, knowledge, understanding, interpreting dreams, solving riddles and explaining enigmas were found in this Daniel, whom the king named Belteshazzar, now let Daniel be called and he will give the interpretation." These enigmas, or hidden mysteries will begin to be revealed this year as those with an excellent spirit and Issachar anointing devote themselves to understanding what has been masked until this point in time. It is a year when people are exhorted to "ask the Lord for a sign" for what

you are pressing for. He will give you one if your eyes are open to see.

A new understanding of time: one of the profound words that we got in Israel when we prayed at the Habakkuk time gate (Habakkuk 2:3) was "right time, right place, right word". This year there will be a revelation of how to move in this and accelerate things on the earth. This is a year of extreme acceleration.

A year of the new wine: many have been going through the narrow place in 2018. This squeezing of the grapes, as it were is about to release the finest of new wines over our nation. Joel 2:19 "I am sending you grain, new wine and olive oil, enough to satisfy you fully; never again will I make you an object of scorn to the nations." Wine speaks of provision and God's favour, and harvest! All of this is ours in 2019. Joel 3:13 "Swing the sickle, for the harvest is ripe. Come, trample the grapes, for the winepress is full and the vats overflow."

Signs will also be linked to displays of God's miracle working power combined with the preaching of the gospel of the Kingdom.

1 Corinthians 4:20 "The Kingdom of God is not in word, but in power." The message of Christ crucified will result in harvest and miracles. The power of the Gospel will be seen on the earth in 2019! Romans 1:3-4 "Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh; and declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead." This is the Gospel that the Holy Spirit confirms with signs following. It is this Gospel that releases the thunder and lightning of God. It is this Gospel that translates people from the Kingdom of Darkness into the Kingdom of God. The Gospel preached will be followed with a host of miracles this year.
